HOME TEAM

When Betsy Riley launched this magazine in 2015 (in its second iteration, though she also launched its first in 2002, mind you), she gave it the tagline “style and substance.” This guiding principle sums up Betsy as much as the magazine. After all, she has been all but synonymous with *Atlanta Magazine’s HOME* since its inception. (Don’t worry, she didn’t go far. Betsy is now the editor in chief of *Atlanta* magazine and the editorial director of *HOME*.)

Which is why there is some pressure that comes with this job. It’s not enough to just look the part. This magazine is about much more than pretty pictures—although there are plenty of those, too. It’s about real, compelling, curl-up-with-a-coffee-mug storytelling.

Case in point: For this issue, writer Josh Green dove into the annals of one of Frank Lloyd

Wright’s last apprentices, an Atlanta architect named Robert Green (no relation to the author), who gets little of the appreciation he’s due (see page 32). He doesn’t even have a Wikipedia page, though he created some of this city’s most intriguing modern architecture and has been dubbed the closest thing we have to FLW. Unless you’re an architecture devotee, you’ve likely never heard of him. But if you know where to look, you can find his cantilevered, geometric Usonian masterpieces tucked

behind trees in quiet pockets of the city. Josh’s piece is our nod to the 150th anniversary of Frank Lloyd Wright’s birth, and it’s just the kind of untold story we love.

Just as I returned from maternity leave to take this position (there’s nothing quite like a new baby to make you appreciate fine interiors), we hired a new creative director, Tom Hurd. In Atlanta by way of Chicago, Boston, and Toronto, Tom has worked mostly as an art director and creative director in the advertising world, with clients like Delta and Mercedes-Benz. He’s got stellar graphic design sense, but he also spent a stint working for an interior design firm in Chicago.

As the former lifestyle editor for *Atlanta*, I’ll be weaving more fashion into the book (see: Acne Studios, page 21; Oscar de la Renta, page 30). There’s no doubt that fashion and interiors are colliding more than ever (for proof, visit the fashion-meets-interiors window displays at ADAC’s Behind the Windows)—and as someone wise once told me, it’s all about context.
