About the 2024 Judges Panel:

Aimee Buccellato, Schafer Buccellato Architects, Partner

Buccellato is a partner at Schafer Buccellato Architects, an award-winning, *AD*100 architecture firm known for designing traditional residences that are elegant, comfortable, and suited to modern living. She received her Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Notre Dame and earned a Master of Design Studies degree from the Graduate School of Design at Harvard University, where she studied early Renaissance theories of composition. Early in her career, she joined her now business partner, Gil Schafer, at G. P. Schafer Architect, as the firm's very first employee. While at GPSA, Buccellato led several of the firm's first award-winning projects and was a formative part of the firm's development. In 2008, she accepted a position teaching at the University of Notre Dame's School of Architecture, where she received tenure in 2017. She founded Buccellato Design with her husband and business partner Kevin Buccellato in 2011, and the firm worked on projects around the country before joining forces with G. P. Schafer Architect, a "coming home" of sorts, in 2023 to create Schafer Buccellato Architects. In addition to having projects featured in an array of national media and winning a variety of awards for completed projects, Buccellato has authored and co-authored 28 academic papers and served as both a member and Vice President of the board of the City of South Bend Venues, Parks, and Arts Commission, appointed by Mayor Pete Buttigieg in 2015. She lives with her family in Essex County, New Jersey.

Corey Damen Jenkins, Corey Damen Jenkins & Associates, Founder and Principal

Founder and Principal at Corey Damen Jenkins & Associates, Jenkins is an award-winning and internationally acclaimed interior designer based in New York City. Jenkins is celebrated for mixing vivid colors with layered patterns to create inspired, iconic, and uplifting spaces, as well as designing furniture that brings the best of the classics into the present with panache and refined elegance. Jenkins is an inductee of Architectural Digest's AD100, ELLE Decor's A-List, 1st Dibs 50, and is a celebrated instructor of Interior Design on the MasterClass educational platform. Jenkins's bold interiors have graced the front covers of House Beautiful and Traditional Home and have received extensive features in many other publications including VERANDA, House & Garden, Vanity Fair, The New York Times, Better Homes and Gardens, ELLE Decor, The Wall Street Journal, and The Detroit News. His first coffee table book, "Design Remix: A New Spin on Traditional Rooms" (Rizzoli), was released worldwide in March 2021 and has entered its seventh reprint.
